


Admission requirements

Master and Graduate Certificate of Business Psychology

To gain entry to the Master of Business Psychology or Graduate Certificate of Business Psychology, applicants must have:

- · a bachelor's degree in a cognate discipline; OR
- where accepted, equivalent prior learning, including at least five years of relevant professional experience*.
- students who possess the equivalent of a fouryear, full-time, non-cognate undergraduate degree may also apply for this program. This includes graduates from four-year bachelor programs in education, nursing and engineering degrees, as well as those from these and other fields who may have completed an honours degree.

- * Relevant professional experience constitutes five years of working in professional contexts underpinned by managing human and team behaviour, motivation and psychology. This includes (but is not limited to) those working in traditional business administration and consulting roles and extends also to those with experience working in healthcare, engineering, education, social and community services
- Academic admission requirements (Band 6) may be satisfied through completion of one of the following: Bachelor degree or equivalent prior learning including at least five years' relevant professional experience.
- English language requirements (Band 4) may be satisfied through completion of one of the following:
 - IELTS Academic Overall band minimum score of 6.5 (no individual band less than 6.0);
 - Bachelor degree from a country specified on the English Proficiency Bands page;
 - Successfully completed 0.375 EFTSL of study at postgraduate level or higher at an Australian higher education provider (or equivalent);
 - Where accepted, equivalent prior learning, including at least five years' relevant professional experience; or
 - Other tests, courses or programs defined on the English Proficiency Bands page.

FEE-HELP

The government loan scheme that applies to most postgraduate courses is known as FEE-HELP. Australian citizens and holders of a Permanent Humanitarian visa who are residing within Australia are eligible to access FEE-HELP. Using this program, you can borrow enough money from the Commonwealth Government to cover your course fees. Once your income reaches a certain level, you will pay the loan back via the tax system.



What does a Student Success Advisor do?

My role as a Student Success Advisor is to guide a student from their first orientation week right through to graduation. If a student has nonacademic enquiries, they come to me! If they have questions about how to use the online learning platform, which units they need to enrol in next or how to keep track of their assessments, I am here to help.

What kind of challenges do students face and how do you help them?

I think a desire to really help people is essential. Students start their course with a goal and a certain level of motivation, but this fluctuates as they juggle life's responsibilities and their studies. You need to be able to assist students in a variety of situations and calmly advise them while keeping the student's best interest in mind.

Do you find your role rewarding?

Units of study

Healthy Work and Wellbeing / HRM6006

Unit description

The unit explores workplace culture, mental health and work stressors, as well as positive workplace behaviour, and how these impact employee health and wellbeing. Interventions and mechanisms for promoting healthy workplaces and employee wellbeing will also be examined.

Managing and Rewarding Performance / HRM6005

Unit description

Motivating and rewarding employees provides benefits not only for the employee but also the organisation. These are important aspects of performance management, a process that is required to obtain the best from employees, provide a stimulating and interesting work environment and achieve organisational goals. In this unit, students explore the processes involved in managing employee performance within an organisation from both an individual and team perspective.

People Analytics / HRM6008

Unit description

This unit develops students' applied analytical skills and knowledge of digital Human Resource Management (HRM) systems in practice. Through exploring the content and engaging with the learning activities, the unit cultivates evidence-based decision-making capability, incorporating data analysis, within the context of people management.

Managing Change / HRM6011

Unit description

The capability to lead change is critical for Human Resource Management (HRM) professionals and managers at all levels as our organisations need to continually adapt to global competition and a fast changing environment. The unit aims to build knowledge of change practices, and the capability to determine appropriate leadership actions in diverse contexts.

Participants will use the frameworks explored in class to investigate the leadership of a change within a workplace with which they are familiar, and critique that change process indicating how it could be improved. Participants will also make a personal self-assessment and development plan to build their change management capability.

Psychological Science of Wellbeing / PSY6800

Unit description

In this unit students will apply psychological science to analysing and promoting psychological wellbeing within a biopsychosocial framework. Students will explore cultural differences in the conceptualisation and expression of psychological health and wellbeing across the lifespan. Students will learn evidence-based strategies for selfmanagement and wellbeing in academic and personal contexts.

Psychological Sciences of Human Social Behaviour / PSY6815

Unit description

In this unit students will learn about core concepts in social psychology, including attributions, attitude formation and change, social influence, group processes and decision-making, prejudice and discrimination, and prosocial behaviour. Students will analyse and apply social psychology theories to a range of contemporary local and global issues and events.

Psychological Science of Human Information Processing / PSY6825

Unit description

In this unit students will learn about core concepts, principles, and theories of cognitive psychology, learning and language, including information processing, cognitive biases and errors, learning and skills acquisition, memory, and executive functioning. Students will consider the application of cognitive psychology theories and principles to maximising human performance across a range of contemporary applications.

Neuroscience and Human Behaviour / PSY6835

Unit description

In this unit students will learn about the biopsychological and physiological bases of human behaviours and contemporary methodologies for studying neurobiological functioning. Students will explore applications of neuroscience to contemporary issues in society.

Electives

Acquiring and Managing Talent / HRM6004

Unit description

Students will critically evaluate the talent management paradigm, inclusive of the functions of recruitment and development, and how these generate high performance work environments.

Diversity and Inclusion / HRM6007

Unit description

This unit explores the principles and practices for cultivating a diverse, inclusive and innovative workplace. Through exploring the content and engaging with the learning activities, the unit cultivates awareness and understanding of the core opportunities and challenges associated with diverse workforces.

Project Management / CYB6008

Unit description

Project management skills cross subject and functional boundaries to facilitate the holistic solution of complex problems in many industries. It introduces students to the stages of project management from initial project selection through to final closure. Topic areas include project selection, planning, estimating, quality management, risk management, managing stakeholders, developing the project team and the use of appropriate project planning software.

Students will generate and evaluate complex strategies and opportunities to support the application of technology and investment proposals. Research and communicate to specialist and non-specialist audiences information and plans to solve problems and manage risk.

Managing People and Organisations / HRM6000

Unit description

In this unit students are introduced to the fundamentals of management and different organisational processes in the context of the contemporary global business environment. Students will demonstrate cross-cultural awareness, including cultural competence necessary to effectively manage. Particular emphasis is placed on the application of theory to matters that may confront managers today and into the future.

Transformative Leadership / MBA6066

Unit description

Leadership represents the most important area of competence for managers today. This unit first acquaints students with contemporary theories and then unpacks a toolkit of practical skills for professional development across relevant topics. Important aspects of the modern international business environment are discussed to develop a global perspective. The focus is on personal growth and enabling positive transformation.

Data Analytics and Organisational Decision Making / MBA6045

Unit description

This unit will develop and enhance students' conceptual and practical understanding of big data and analytics in a business context. Students will explore how to tackle the many issues that are associated with evidence-based decision making such as information governance, privacy, security, ethical considerations, understanding the value of a company's data and developing a business case to implement.
