

# Chapter by chapter...

Your journey to your Master of Creative Writing will unfold before you like the chapters of a book you simply can't put down.

#### Writing Fiction / WRT6400

#### **Unit description**

The stories of our culture are the things that define us for future generations. Storytelling is an integral part of who we are and how we relate to each other. This unit introduces the fundamentals of writing fiction through reading a range of short stories. It includes elements of literary craft such as narrative theory, point of view, voice, writing dialogue and characterisation.

## Writing Realities / WRT6405

#### **Unit description**

The truth is stranger than fiction, or so they say. This unit explores writing based on actual events, including history, biography, true crime and stories of place and family. It includes narrative strategies for non-fiction and creative non-fiction and introduces techniques for research and content writing for online audiences.



# Writing for Performance / WRT6410

#### Unit description

Theatre comes from a long tradition dating back to Ancient Greece and First Nations Peoples, telling the story of who we are and where we come from. This unit introduces skills for writing drama or monologue for performance. It explores the use of language in different ways for different forms that are intended to be experienced live or aloud. Journals will be used as a means to capture ideas and refine drafts.

# Writing and Audience / WRT6415

#### **Unit description**

Writers need readers, and an awareness of your audience can help you improve your craft and message. This unit cultivates a writer's understanding of their work with consideration of genre and readership, including online audiences. Students will develop a deep understanding of diversity and their own voice in writing and explore writing for specific audiences, such as popular fiction, young adults and children.

# Editing and Publishing / WRT6420

#### **Unit description**

The publication process is an essential element in a successful writer's career, and new writers need to know the steps involved in this journey to realise the full potential of their creative work. This unit explores the business of writing, editing and publishing, including processes and workflow for professional editing, seeking publication and presenting the professional author platform.

# Writing for the Planet's Future / WRT6425

#### **Unit description**

We live in an age of upheaval and environmental change, and writers are at the forefront of helping us negotiate the human condition with this new paradigm. This unit takes an ecocritical approach to writing about place and environment in the production of fiction, poetry and non-fiction. It explores authors who highlight contemporary environmental concerns through a variety of lenses, such as cli-fi, post-apocalyptic and ecofeminist work.

# Writing and Empathy / WRT6430

#### **Unit description**

Stories give us a window into the emotions and experiences of others, and it is essential for writers to find ways to depict authentic emotions to build a connection with their audience. This unit explores the core practice of writing and embodiment — including writing about love and characters outside our own viewpoint. It includes writing with empathy about animals and the nonhuman world and drawing on your own lived experiences.

# Writing Fiction that Scares and Unsettles / WRT6435

#### **Unit description**

Fear is fundamental to the human experience, and scary stories take us back to our origins. This unit explores the darker aspects of fiction, including genres such as horror and gothic, as well as thematic concerns like violence, trauma and conflict. It introduces the sublime, which examines our reaction to forces beyond our understanding in form, scale and time.

# Writing Project: Research and Development / WRT6440

#### **Unit description**

This is the first of two capstone units that give writing students a deep dive into a project of their choice. In this unit, students initiate, plan and develop a writing project, which is of a significant scope. It includes the development of a premise and synopsis to summarise their work for a future publisher.

# Writing Project: Resolve and Reflect / WRT6450

#### **Unit description**

Students conclude their writing journey in this second capstone unit to see the realisation of their dream projects. In this unit, students continue and complete the project initiated in the first Writing Project unit. Then, they create a podcast to get a feel for presenting their work to a future audience.

# Master of Creative Writing / Graduate Diploma of Creative Writing / Graduate Certificate of Creative Writing

To gain entry to the Master of Creative Writing, Graduate Diploma of Creative Writing or Graduate Certificate of Creative Writing, applicants must have:

- A bachelor's degree in any discipline; OR
- Equivalent prior learning, including at least five years of relevant professional experience, or prospective students must submit a piece of published work.

# Master of Creative Writing (Fast-Track)

To gain entry to the Master of Creative Writing (Fast-Track)\*, applicants must have:

 A bachelor's degree or higher in English, Journalism, Communications, Writing or Creative Writing, Secondary English Teaching or similar (as assessed by ECU). \*To gain entry to the fast-track masters, students must apply after they accept the offer for the 10-unit masters. Applications for the fast-tracked master degree are subject to ECU's assessment.

^Bachelor degree must be completed within the last 10 years.

#### English language requirements (Band 4) may be satisfied through completion of one of the following:

- IELTS Academic overall band minimum score of 6.5 (no individual band less than 6.0);
   Bachelor's degree from a country specified on the English Proficiency Bands page;
- successfully completed 0.375 EFTSL of study at postgraduate level or higher at an Australian higher education provider (or equivalent);
- where accepted, equivalent prior learning, including at least five years' relevant professional experience; or
- other tests, courses or programs defined on the English Proficiency Bands page.

#### FEE-HELP


The government loan scheme that applies to most postgraduate courses is known as FEE-HELP. Australian citizens and holders of a Permanent Humanitarian visa who are residing within Australia are eligible to access FEE-HELP. Using this program, you can borrow enough money from the Commonwealth Government to cover your course fees. Once your income reaches a certain level, you will pay the loan back via the tax system.
